Clinical pharmacology debate in the House of Lords

On the evening of 12 September, Lord Hunt of Kings Heath led a debate in the House of Lords, outlining the importance of clinical pharmacologists in the UK and calling for immediate action to tackle the reduction of clinical pharmacologists practicing in the NHS and teaching in universities




